## Placements

WBL students have been placed into their internships. Please be aware that your student needs to have 85 hours of work completed by the end of the semester if they are a 1-hour intern, or 170 hours for 2-hour interns. Students should be logging their hours as they complete them using the document found on Canvas under the 'Quarter 1 Work Log' assignment. ## WBL Coursework

All coursework for Work-Based Learning can be found in Canvas, both on the Calendar and in Modules. I sync grades for these assignments weekly with PowerSchool, so students can check PowerSchool once a week to stay updated with their grade. Please note, I do accept late work until final grades are due at the end of the semester. However, be sure your student knows that coursework is **REQUIRED** to earn credit for this class. There are typically 1-2 assignments per week for 1-hour interns, and 2-3 assignments per week for 2-hour interns. Additionally, all interns will be required to submit a portfolio at the end of the semester. 2-hour interns will also need a certification for their portfolio.
